Dear members, friends and guests of First Presbyterian Church,

In the name of our Lord and God, may you be blessed with reflection and meditation in the balance of Lent. May you be encouraged and strengthened—filled with joy—as we celebrate Easter!

Rev. Professor Peter J. Gomes (1942-2011) at Harvard Divinity School and minister at Harvard Memorial Church writes: "The resurrection is God's way of getting our attention. It is God's way of making us listen up, God's way of getting us to look, to listen, and to live. This first thing to remember, once God gets our attention, is that there is nothing subtle about Easter, nothing vague or ambiguous or vain or clever or cute about it at all. To make that point, God does not begin Easter day as the slow, gradual triumph of the dawn over the darkness; rather he takes a leaf from the notebook of Cecile B. DeMille himself, and God begins Easter with an earthquake."

The preparation and celebration of Jesus' resurrection is a wake-up call to our spiritual lives. In a miraculous way, God gets our attention, and then gives the miracle of eternal life through Jesus. He is risen! is the Easter acclamation. God gives new life. God gives eternal life. With this incredible message we must listen, love, and live. May God bless your life in Christ through the joys of Easter Faith.

## Notes from the Director of Music

My last article covered our worship opportunities for Holy Week and Easter, so I won't run through those again: you'll find the schedule on our website or elsewhere in this newsletter. Instead, I'd like to use my space this month to extend an invitation to the congregation.

Did you know that handbell ringing has been a component of First Presbyterian's music ministry since the 1970s? Over the years our Liberty Bell Choir has not only rung in worship, but in various settings outside our walls as well, such as care homes and the Garden Club's "Trees of Christmas". The skill and dedication required to put such complicated pieces together is evident each time they ring. Some of our current ringers have been active since before I was born, and I'm immensely grateful for the countless hours they've put into rehearsing week by week.

However, it's been suggested to me that a slower-paced, lower-commitment handbell group might be more appealing to people who have never tried ringing before, or whose skills are a little rusty. To that end, I'd like to gauge how much interest there might be if we were to launch such a group. This would be open to people of all ages, with a goal of learning the technique of ringing bells and preparing some simple music to ring in church occasionally. We would need to find a rehearsal time: one possibility is Sundays from 12:00-12:30 PM, but I'm open to other suggestions as well. If you've ever thought that ringing bells might be fun, here's your opportunity to give it a try in a low-pressure setting! You'll be hearing more about this in the near future, but don't hesitate to reach out to me now if you're interested.

#### THE GREAT AND GLORIOUS CELEBRATION OF THE RESURRECTION

<u>The Book of Common</u> <u>Worship</u>, 2018 edition, a handbook for worship and ministry notes that: "The

Resurrection of the Lord is the center of the Christian year, and the good news we proclaim on this day is the very heart of the gospel. Easter Sunday is something like the keystone of an arch—the top and center stone upon which all the others lean and depend—in terms of both its theological significance and its relation to other festivals and seasons. Theologically, the faith we claim and the life we live depend on the affirmation, celebration, and proclamation of Christ's resurrection." ...

"As with Christmas, Easter refers not only to a single day, but to a whole season of celebration in the Christian year. The season of Easter spans the fifty days between the Resurrection of the Lord and the Day of Pentecost and encompasses the Ascension of the Lord.

The seven weeks of the Easter season make up a 'week of weeks' (seven times seven): a symbol in time of the fullness and abundance of God's grace. In ancient practice, fasting and kneeling were forbidden during the weeks of Easter. In this most joyful season, we celebrate the great mystery of our faith—that Jesus Christ is risen from the dead." (Book of Common Worship, Westminster John Knox Press, Louisville. 2018. p. 316.)

The Lenten and Easter Season provide an excellent opportunity to reach out to family,

neighbors, and friends to invite them to church. Our "special events" offer a good 'non-threatening' invitation to request people to worship with you or to meet you at the church. As you well know, it is a wonderful time to worship and praise our



God. It is a great time to offer the hospitality of the church to those who worship with us.

## A BRIEF SUMMARY FROM SESSION

**MEETING OF MARCH 6.** The Session met on Wednesday, March 6 at 5:30 p.m. Dr. Corll, Interim Senior Pastor, called the meeting to

order. The Session joined together in a responsive Call to Worship from Psalm 119:89-96. Dr. Corll has been using Psalm 119 as the opening Call to Worship since September. Psalm 119 is the longest chapter in the Bible. The Psalm is an acrostic poetic device, in which the eight lines of each stanza begin with the same letter. There are 22 letters in the Hebrew alphabet. The Psalm has a focus on eight themes: commandments, statutes, ordinances, decrees, words, precepts, promise and law. The overall theme of the chapter is: The glories of God's law. Based upon the particular verses (176) presented in a series of eight, the Calls to Worship, consecutively moving through the chapter, would open 22 Session meetings!

Previous minutes were approved. Reports from Financial Secretary, Trustee's, Deacons, and Clerk of Session were received and approved. A summary of the Lake Erie Presbytery meeting of February 13 was distributed. Next meeting of presbytery is May 31 at Camp Lambec, Erie. The newly formed Pastor Nominations Committee gave a report. Committee reports from 10 committees of the church were received. Pastor's report was presented. Preparations for Holy Week and Easter were reviewed and discussed. Communion arrangements for Maundy Thursday, and April were made. An Interim Pastor Report was given highlighting Sunday celebrations, pastoral care, and administrative duties. A new member was received by reaffirmation of faith. New members will be recognized in worship in the near future. Recent deaths and services were noted: Jean Lundahl, William Douglass, Jr. and Rev. Corll's mother in law: Evelyn Satterlee.

Time off for church staff for vacations, continuing education, and study leave were noted.

The Teen Mission Trip for June 11-15 was discussed. The Matthew 25 Initiative was discussed and plans to further develop our church's present efforts to reach out to those in our community, to hear from other Presbyterian churches about their involvement, and to offer Bible Studies on the passage were agreed upon. The former program, Royal Family Kids was discussed and its corporate transition to a new name: For The Children. The materials stored since 2016/17 will be checked and distribution/disbursement arranged. Continuing under Old Business is the review of Membership Rolls in regard to activity and participation of those on the membership roster.

The meeting adjourned with prayer in time for Elders to attend the Soulstice Worship Service. -Rev. Dr. Daniel Corll, Session Moderator

## DR. CORLL TO BE **ON CONTINUING EDUCATION:**

Beginning April 29-May 4, Dan will participate in continuing education at Montreat, North Carolina. Montreat is the home

of Montreat College, and Montreat Conference Center, a retreat and conference center of the Presbyterian Church. Along with seven other ministers, and some with spouses, the group's work is partially underwritten by The Foundation for Reformed Theology. The Seminar Group prepares for the week of self-directed study by reading in advance, John Calvin's, Institutes of Christian Religion: 1541 French Edition. Translated by Elsie Anne McKee. This is the first English translation of this work. Additionally, the group will look at Calvin's, Writings on Pastoral Piety. Edited and with translations by Elsie Anne McKee, 2001. The Institutes has been an anchor for Reformed Theology since its inception. Calvin's intent was to present the text to suit lay audiences, shaping it to clearly teach, exhort, and encourage them. He wrote this edition to indicate what common Christian people should all know and practice. In preparation for the study week, Dan will be taking several days to read the more than 1,000 pages of the texts.

The Foundation for Reformed Theology's purpose is to facilitate better preaching, better teaching and better pastoral care. While the group engages in intense study, there is also opportunity for fellowship, shared meals and conversation about ministry.

#### ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL:

On April 14, 21 and 28 we will be diving into the study, God with Us in Jesus–A Matthew 25 Bible Study.

Matthew 25 has become an important focus in the mission

and ministry of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). Specifically, it informs, inspires, and influences our work on three strategic priorities: eradicating systemic poverty, dismantling structural racism and building congregational vitality. The adult Sunday school class will be considering how Matthew 25: 31-46 speaks to-and leads us to pursue these areas of work. We also will look at three different ways of interpreting the biblical text: a literal/plain reading, a historical/critical reading, and a spiritual/symbolic reading. Join us as we read, reflect, and respond to how God's word speaks to us as we strive to live a life that reflects Christian love.
