May 2024



Greetings in the name of our Lord. As we encounter springtime days, may you be blessed and enriched with the bounty of God's creation and the beauty of the world around you.

Since Easter our Sunday worship celebrations have been focused on the Six Great Ends of the Church. These statements are found in the Constitution of the Presbyterian Church (USA). They are found in the Book of Order, volume two of the Constitution. They have been a hallmark of

our church. Adopted in 1910 these missional statements are intended to define the life and work of the church. They give us direction for our ministry and create a goal to attain in our spiritual lives.

THE GREAT ENDS OF THE CHURCH:

The proclamation of the gospel for the salvation of humankind. The shelter, nurture, and spiritual fellowship of the children of God. The maintenance of divine worship. The preservation of the truth. The promotion of spiritual righteousness. The exhibition of the Kingdom of Heaven to the world.

Our lives as individuals and as the church are focused on God's purpose for us in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. We anticipate Christ's return and Jesus' reign in our lives. We understand that through Colossians 1:18-20, when we read this insight:

"He (Christ) is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything. For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross."

As believers that is our goal, that in our lives, through living out the Great Ends of the Church, by the expression of our faith that Christ **"might come to have first place in everything"** through what we say and do.

I will be preaching on the Great Ends of the Church through May 12. You are invited to join the fellowship of faith in celebration of Christ the next few weeks. Another great celebration comes to our worship life on May 19: Pentecost Sunday, when we commemorate the birthday of the church—the gift of the Holy Spirit. We will celebrate communion at both worship services. Additionally, we will install and ordain church officers, which were elected back in January. It will be a festive and celebrative day. The next week, May 26 is Trinity Sunday, and it is Memorial Day weekend, when we move to our summer schedule for worship.

There is much happening at your church. Plan to participate and celebrate our life together.

Notes from the Director of Music

This month I have the opportunity to do something I've never done before: go on tour with a choir. The Allegheny College Choir (along with twenty alumni) will fly to Scandinavia after Mother's Day for its first international tour in seven years, visiting Copenhagen, Oslo, Uppsala, and Stockholm. By my reckoning this will be the longest stretch of time I've ever been away from my family! We'll present a concert in each city, as well as collaborating with the NOVA Chamber Choir of Oslo and its conductor, Julia Selina. My job – in addition to being the token Canadian on the trip – is to accompany the choir on piano and organ. I'm quite excited for the opportunity not only to visit but to make music in these historic buildings, some of which date back eight centuries.

On the topic of choirs, I also want to take this opportunity to acknowledge the work our church choir and Liberty Bells have put into enriching our worship over the past year. We've explored a wide variety of repertoire in the process: classical compositions, Gregorian and Orthodox chant, arrangements of spirituals and folk hymns, and a few newly written pieces as well. The choir's last Sunday for the season will be May 5th. Despite my protests, two of our choral scholars - Isabella James and Anthony Swanson – will conclude their time with us that morning as they prepare to graduate from Allegheny College and embark on the next chapter of their lives. I encourage you to come out on the 5th as we say farewell to Bella and Anthony! Until next time,

P.R.A.Y. ended on April 17th. An average of 8 children attended each session. The volunteer leaders, assistants and cooks were awesome. Thank you for your support.





Over the last two weeks in April, the committee analyzed profiles of 24 candidate matches and one profile from a candidate who reached out to the committee with interest. When wintertime came with all of its white snow, the hills changed into sparkling shimmering diamonds. With all of this beauty surrounding us, we all were very happy."

The woman who wrote this, Robbie Mae Franklin Penman, emigrated from Tennessee to Meadville during "The Great Migration." She eventually moved to Cleveland, became active in civil affairs and served as the first senior intern to Representative Louis Stokes. She lived to be 106!



Grades K-3 went on a walking field trip to participate in a literacy event at the FCCA. We had so much fun! The kids enjoyed stories, snacks, and activities. Each child got to choose a free book to take home! The egg hunt was a great success! We could never have done it as well without the five moms

who helped to plan and supervise. We counted 40 kids and over 20 adults in attendance. We've ordered the first several STEM toys from the grant we received from the Crawford Heritage Foundation, supplemented by a donation from the Presbyterian Women. The hollow blocks and colorful wooden rainbow have both been greatly enjoyed since we received them! Afterschool attendance has increased again. One day when there was no school, we opened the door at 3:00 p.m. to a dozen kids waiting in the hallway! After more trickled in, we had a total of 18 kids that day. PRESBYTERIAN DISASTER ASSISTANCE (PDA) enables congregations and mission partners of the PC (U.S.A) to witness the healing love of Christ through caring for communities adversely affected by crisis and catastrophic events. PDA is an emergency and refugee program. From initial disaster response to ongoing community development, it helps provide people with safety, sustenance, and

hope. The focus is on long-term recovery by connecting partners locally and internationally with key organization active in the response such as United Nations, NVOAD (National Voluntary Agencies Active in Disaster), World Food Program, Red Cross, FEMA and others. The Birthday Offering of Presbyterian Women was born in 1922 when Hallie Paxson Winsborough challenged members of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Presbyterian Church in the United States to give a penny for each year of her life as a

"birthday gift." Hallie encouraged the women to offer "a penny for every year you have lived, and if that is a secret, bring a dollar!" Over the last century, this offering has provided grants to more than 200 major projects including the following 2024 grant recipients.

Bethel Hills Apartments and Recreation Area (Marthasville, Missouri) - The grant will be used to renovate one of their villas into four accessible apartments for eight individuals with developmental and intellectual disabilities. It will provide a safe and loving place that takes into consideration their physical, emotional and spiritual needs in an environment where they can flourish. The new recreational area will offer space for art and music therapy and other leisure activities for people with and without intellectual and developmental disabilities.

Shawnee Presbyterian Church Café Gingko (Louisville, Kentucky) - Located in an economically disadvantaged area where single mothers and children face challenges of food insecurity, the church began serving free dine-in meals every Monday. With this grant, Café Gingko will be able to reopen with a renovated kitchen and an expanded capacity to provide meals. Improvements to the fellowship hall will allow the church to offer enriching activities: tutoring for elementary ages, Gingko Play Zone, financial literacy classes and Mama-to-Mama parenting workshops.
